Summary

Capt. Elijah Clarke's Company was guarding some goods (goods of Jacob Patterson and Richard Woods) that were being moved from Petersborough and were attacked about five miles from Fort Loggy. They were attacked by Indians and three men were killed and three wounded. Killed were Jacob Patterson, Giles Tillet (Tiblet) and Peter Davis. Wounded were Captain Clarke (shot in the knee), Job Hinton and James Smith. Then Clarke's Company moved to Clarke's Station and another battle ensued (Charles Gent S-1903 and David H. Thurmond S-32010).
