October Meeting Highlights

Our regular September monthly meeting was highlighted by Terry Manning's presentation of "George Washington and the Creek Indians – The McGillivray Moment" – Washington's views and diplomacy in dealing with the Creek Indians circa 1790. Past President Manning continues to come up with new and interesting programs that he presents not only to our Atlanta Chapter, but to other SAR Chapters, DAR Chapters and many other civic and patriotic organizations. We thank Terry for his representing the Atlanta Chapter in such a positive way.

Our new **Chapter Chaplain**, **J.R. McAliley** was installed by **Terry Manning**. We are grateful to J. R. for taking on this role, and we will look forward to having such a positive person represent our Chapter in the position.

David Noble and Richard Marsh's new book "Patriots in Georgia Revolutionary War Engagements 1775-1783" is being printed. Richard Marsh presented a Resolution to the Chapter that laid out the terms by which the Chapter would accept certain rights pertaining to the book. The resolution was discussed at length and passed pending approval by the Board of Managers. (The Resolution was passed by the BOM at its meeting following the regular membership meeting.) The potential proceeds of the book will allow the Atlanta Chapter to fund Revolutionary War related projects at a level never envisioned in the past. The Chapter and all of SAR are indebted to Richard and David for their work and their generosity.

As the Atlanta Chapter continues to grow, we were priviledged to induct our newest member **Douglass French Covey**. We were also able to present to **Jim Freeman** the membership certificates for three additional members, the grandsons of Jim, **Christopher Alliger**, **Matthew Alliger and Patrick Alliger**. Thanks to **David Noble and Jim Freeman** for bringing in these newest members.

Henry Cobb works hard to help any and all of our members submit paperwork for **Supplemental Applications**. While he is at it, Henry has completed 14 such applications for himself, and he was presented the Certificate for that 14th Supplemental at the meeting.

Veterans Day at Atlanta History Center

WE WERE SOLDIERS AUTHOR JOE GALLOWAY TO GIVE KEYNOTE SPEECH AT ATLANTA HISTORY CENTER'S ANNUAL VETERANS DAY PROGRAM

Program Theme is 'Gatheround: Stories of Service'

Atlanta, GA – The Atlanta History Center's annual Veterans Day program will feature a keynote speech by Joe Galloway, one of America's premiere war correspondents and co-author of the international bestseller *We Were Soldiers Once...* And Young, which was adapted into the acclaimed movie *We Were Soldiers*. Generously sponsored by Regions Bank and free to veterans and the general public, the Veterans Day commemoration will begin at 11 AM Friday, November 11, 2016.

The address by Galloway, a Bronze Star awardee who recently retired as the senior military correspondent for Knight Ridder Newspapers, befits this year's Veterans Day program theme, *Gatheround: Stories of Service*. The theme is a salute to the newly opened Atlanta History Center exhibition *Gatheround: Stories of Atlanta*, which extensively employs oral history and Meet the Past museum theatre presentations, among other storytelling practices, to share the city's history.

Galloway is considered a storyteller par excellence of the theater of war. He is serving as an ongoing consultant as well as a voiceover contributor to Ken Burns, whose Florentine Films is producing a 10-part, 18-and-a-half-hour documentary series on the Vietnam War for PBS, planned to premiere in fall 2017. He also is serving as a special consultant to the 50th Anniversary Vietnam War Commemoration program conducted by the U.S. Department of Defense.

In 1998, Galloway was awarded a Bronze Star with Valor for rescuing wounded soldiers under fire at la Drang, the only civilian to receive a combat medal from the U.S, Army during the Vietnam War.

The late Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf called the native Texan "the finest combat correspondent of our generation --- a soldier's reporter and a soldier's friend." Galloway served four tours as a Vietnam correspondent and chronicled more than a half dozen other combat operations across the globe.

The Atlanta History Center's Veterans Day program will open with a bagpipe presentation; welcoming remarks by master of ceremonies Major Scott Delius of the Georgia Army National Guard, an Afghanistan veteran; the presentation of the colors by the Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution; and Atlanta Opera soloist Timothy Miller performing the National Anthem. The 116th Army Band will play patriotic selections starting at 10:30 AM and perform during the program, as well.

In a salute to the 75th anniversary of the USO, Mary Lou Austin, President and CEO of the USO Council of Georgia, will lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Founded in 1941 just prior to the onset of America's involvement in World War II, the USO (United Service Organizations) keeps members of America's military connected to family, home, and country throughout their service to the nation.

The invocation and benediction will be provided by former POW Robert Certain, a Vietnam veteran. U.S. Army Col. David Moore (Retired) will introduce keynote speaker Galloway, who now resides in North Carolina. Moore is a son of Lt. Gen. Hal Moore (Retired), Galloway's co-author of *We Were Soldiers Once... And Young.*

The Veterans Day program will be held in the Atlanta History Center's Veterans Park, which is dedicated to all of the men and women who have served -- and continue to serve -- the United States. Funded by a generous grant from The Home Depot Foundation, Veterans Park was designed as a unique gathering place, encouraging reflection, personal connections to veterans, and a celebration of the lives of those who have sacrificed to secure our freedom. Veterans Park was dedicated in 2013 with a "sacred soil" ceremony. This soil was collected from every site where our country has fought for freedom, and was scattered upon Veterans Park's ground by veterans.

A cornerstone of Veterans Park is stories from the Atlanta History Center's Veterans History Project featured on a series of panels throughout the park. Each panel features a QR code – compatible with any smartphone – allowing visitors to easily access videos of veterans sharing their personal stories, memories, tragedies, and triumphs of their service to our country.

Following the ceremony, Galloway will sign copies of We Were Soldiers Once... And Young in the Atlanta History Center atrium. The 1992 bestseller is available in six languages, with more than 1.2 million copies sold. Mel Gibson starred in the critically acclaimed 2002 film adaption.

Galloway serves as a special consultant to the Vietnam War 50th Anniversary Commemoration project run by the Office of the Secretary of Defense. Before joining Knight Ridder Newspapers, he worked for more than two decades each for United Press International and U.S. News & World Report magazine.

Also inside the atrium after the ceremony, there will be informational tables for the Veterans History Project and Atlanta History Center membership as well as for the USO.

Launched in 1999, the Veterans History Project has conducted 600 veteran interviews. "The Atlanta History Center is committed to collecting, preserving, and sharing veteran stories so that future generations can hear directly from those who served and better appreciate the realities of war and peacetime service," said Sue VerHoef, Atlanta History Center Director of Oral History and Genealogy. Active and retired military, veterans and up to five members of their families will receive free admission to the entire Atlanta History Center campus from 10 AM to 5:30 PM November 11, 2016.

In addition to Regions Bank, the Veterans Day program is being presented with the support of USAA, the Atlanta Vietnam Veterans Business Association (AVVBA) and the Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America (IAVA).

ABOUT THE ATLANTA HISTORY CENTER

Founded in 1926, the Atlanta History Center is an all-inclusive, 33-acre destination featuring the Atlanta History Museum, one of the nation's largest history museums; three historic houses, the 1920s Swan House, the 1860s Smith Family Farm, and the 1830s Wood Family Cabin; the Kenan Research Center; the Grand Overlook event space; a museum shop sharing space with a Souper Jenny café; and the 22-acre Goizueta Gardens with plantings, paths, and trails.
