
Upcoming Regular Atlanta Chapter Meetings

Our speakers for September will be Joan and Mel Gordon authors of the book: "Pulaski The Forgotten Hero of Two Worlds"





Mel and Joan Gordon are devoted to raising awareness of the many significant contributions General Casimir Pulaski made in Poland, his homeland, and in America where he died as a Revolutionary War hero on a battlefield in Savannah. They bring considerable experience, talent, and tenacity to their near obsessive endeavor.

Joan read *Gone with the Wind* when she was fourteen and vowed she would leave the poverty and harshness of the Appalachian Mountains to move to her heart's true home, Georgia. Typical of much of her life, she accomplished her goal. She received her BBA and MBA at Georgia State University with a 4.0 GPA.

Mel attended the University of Georgia on a voice scholarship. From there, he moved to New York and began performing as a singer, model, and actor. In the midst of becoming a "Marlboro Man", and capturing the title role in an upcoming film, *Tarzan*, he was drafted into the Army during the Vietnam War Era.

This should be a very interesting presentation.

Limited Supply of Books Remaining (there will not be more).

If you have been thinking about purchasing a book now is the time.

The proceeds from the book to the Atlanta Chapter are approximately **\$19,000** To put that into perspective, our Chapter would normally have less than \$1,000 per year available to fund the types of projects that these proceeds will fund. This is a monumental opportunity that David and Richard have made available to our Chapter and to the preservation of the 42 known battle sites in Georgia. Members are encouraged to purchase a book for personal use or as a donation to a library or other organization. Out of 300 books the chapter has distributed two thirds of the books. There are less than **50 books remaining.**

The Chapter has set a goal to get copies of this book into as many libraries and research facilities in Georgia and across the nation as possible. To achieve this, we are encouraging the purchase and donation of books. All net proceeds from the sale of the book will be used to preserve and support research Georgia Revolutionary War battle sites. Volunteers Needed

NSSAR has embarked on a Patriot Index System (similar to DAR). Volunteers are needed to do data entry for the State of Georgia. If you track your volunteer hours, you may receive the Lafayette Volunteer Award medal which is a National recognition for 40 hours of volunteer work.

Once accepted as a volunteer, you are sent instructions in one email and your login and temporary password in a second email. Once you are signed up. the National Committee will send you applications to enter. When you finish the batch, you email the committee and they will send you the next batch

The system was developed by a group of compatriots in North Carolina. The system is well laid out and very easy to operate. You are simply entering the lineage on each application. Each member is linked to the patriot on the application. Once you enter an application, you have to tell the system the application is ready for review Once you do that, you cannot go back to edit the application. The reviewer will make any final changes. Once that is done, the application is published.

For current members, once their application is entered, you will only be able to see from generation 4 down. It appears that a lot of thought has been given to how the system operates. We will only have so many volunteers in Georgia, so you might be entering applications from different chapters. This is not a short-term project. We have over 1,800 current members, so that is our base. We are the second state to begin entering data. They are watching the system to make sure it operates as designed. Our Chapter in the Community

Terry Manning, David Noble and John Titus continue to represent SAR and the Atlanta Chapter with their many presentations to groups of all types.

During the first 3 months of **2018 Terry presented** programs on behalf of SAR to **over 1,100 individuals**. It is not likely that any other individual in the State Society reaches more individuals on an annual basis than does Terry.

David Noble also continues his work with preservation and exploration of Revolutionary War battlefields. His major efforts contine on reseraching Col. John Dooly's home death and burial location.

Veterans Respect Activities

The role of the Veterans Respect Committee is to pursue opportunities to honor and recognize current service members and veterans of past service. A wide range of activities fall under this charge. Some examples are:

-hours served in the VA Hospital (VAH) Volunteer Service,
-visiting a veteran in a VAH, nursing home or private home,
-donating personal care items to a VAH or nursing home serving veterans,
-donating publications to a VAH,
-organizing an outing for one or more veterans,
-participating in a veteran's funeral as a participant, pallbearer, or attendee,
-attendance at Revolutionary War Veteran's Grave Marking,
-participating in placing flags or wreaths on veteran's graves.

We are aware that many of our Atlanta Chapter members have been involved in such activities, but do not know the extent. We would like to gather information on such efforts. A new Georgia Society Chapter is being organized in Washington County (Sandersville), GA.


Parking

Some members have asked about parking at Petite Violette. They provide valet parking and there is some parking available at the office building next door at 2948 Clairmont Rd. Below is a photo of the path from this parking area at the first Visitor Parking sign to the restaurant.



Have you had a difficult time leaving Petite Violette to go back North on Clairmont Rd? If so here are a couple of potential solutions (see map below):

- 1) Exit to the right and get into the far-left lane as though you were going to get onto I-85 North, instead make a Uturn under I-85 on Clairmont.
- 2) Exit to the right and turn right as though you were going to I-85 South, stay in the far-right lane on the frontage road and then turn right onto Briarwood Road between the Life Storage building and REI. This will take you to Buford Highway where you can turn right which will take you back to Clairmont Rd.
