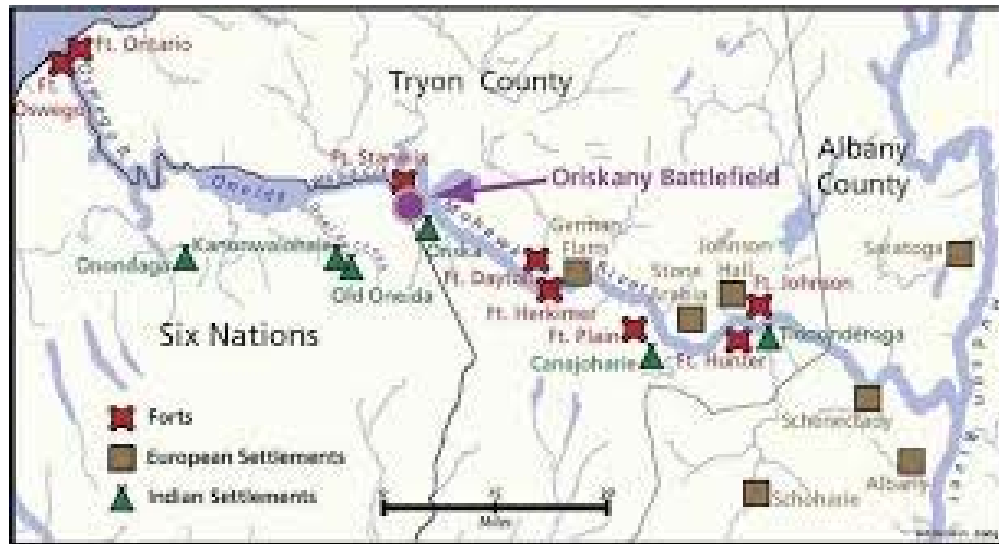

Limited Supply of Books Remaining (there will not be more).

If you have been thinking about purchasing a book now is the time.

The proceeds from the book to the Atlanta Chapter are approximately **\$19,000**. To put that into perspective, our Chapter would normally have less than \$1,000 per year available to fund the types of projects that these proceeds will fund. This is a monumental opportunity that David and Richard have made available to our Chapter and to the preservation of the 42 known battle sites in Georgia. Members are encouraged to purchase a book for personal use or as a donation to a library or other organization. Out of 300 books the chapter has distributed two thirds of the books. **There are fewer than 50 books remaining.**

The Chapter has set a goal to get copies of this book into as many libraries and research facilities in Georgia and across the nation as possible. To achieve this, we are encouraging the purchase and donation of books. All net proceeds from the sale of the book will be used to preserve and support research Georgia Revolutionary War battle sites. Some locations in Georgia that do not have a copy of the book are:

Dougherty County (Albany), Washington County (Sandersville), Laurens County (Dublin), Ware County (Waycross), Coffee County (Douglas), Henry County (McDonough), Houston County (Perry), Lowndes County (Valdosta). If you are interested in purchasing a book for a library in one of these locations please contact Richard Marsh. This is not a comprehensive list of the locations without books.

Volunteers Needed

NSSAR has embarked on a Patriot Index System (similar to DAR). Volunteers are needed to do data entry for the State of Georgia. If you track your volunteer hours, you may receive the Lafayette Volunteer Award medal which is a National recognition for 40 hours of volunteer work.

Once accepted as a volunteer, you are sent instructions in one email and your login and temporary password in a second email. Once you are signed up, the National Committee will send you applications to enter. When you finish the batch, you email the committee and they will send you the next batch

The system was developed by a group of compatriots in North Carolina. The system is well laid out and very easy to operate. You are simply entering the lineage on each application. Each member is linked to the patriot on the application. Once you enter an application, you have to tell the system the application is ready for review. Once you do that, you cannot go back to edit the application. The reviewer will make any final changes. Once that is done, the application is published.

For current members, once their application is entered, you will only be able to see from generation 4 down. It appears that a lot of thought has been given to how the system operates. We will only have so many volunteers in Georgia, so you might be entering applications from different chapters. This is not a short-term project. We have over 1,800 current members, so that is our base. We are the second state to begin entering data. They are watching the system to make sure it operates as designed. **If you are interested let Richard Marsh or Henry Cobb know.**

We hope to see you there.

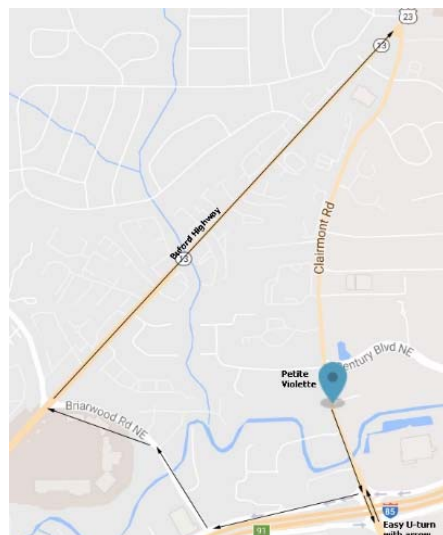
Parking

Some members have asked about parking at Petite Violette. They provide valet parking and there is some parking available at the office building next door at 2948 Clairmont Rd. Below is a photo of the path from this parking area at the first Visitor Parking sign to the restaurant.



Have you had a difficult time leaving Petite Violette to go back North on Clairmont Rd? If so here are a couple of potential solutions (see map below):

- 1) Exit to the right and get into the far-left lane as though you were going to get onto I-85 North, instead make a U-turn under I-85 on Clairmont.
- 2) Exit to the right and turn right as though you were going to I-85 South, stay in the far-right lane on the frontage road and then turn right onto Briarwood Road between the Life Storage building and REI. This will take you to Buford Highway where you can turn right which will take you back to Clairmont Rd.

In October 2010, the NSSAR Library began operations in its new facility on West Main Street in Louisville's historic Museum District. The primary focal point of the collections is the Revolutionary War era but the collection includes other materials of a genealogical nature. To date, the library collection has grown to over 55,000 items and includes family histories, local, county and state records and genealogy materials, and access to the online databases of Ancestry, Heritage Quest, Fold3, and the New England Historical and Genealogical Society.

The Library's growth depends upon cash gifts as well as donations of family genealogies, Revolutionary War histories, county and state histories, and other books and items of genealogical content.

The SAR Library is a non-circulating, reference facility only. It is open free of charge to SAR, DAR, SR, and C.A.R. members, and spouses of SAR members, at any time and to the public for a fee of five dollars per day. **The Friends of the SAR Library (FOL)** was organized to assist the SAR Library in implementing its collection development objectives. These objectives include those books, manuscripts, microforms, and online services as needed to enhance and expand the current collection.
