Program

The Atlanta Chapter is honored to have another outstanding speaker for November. He is one of our own Compatriots, Dr. David Noble, whose topic is: *Kettlecreek Battlefield Revisited*.

The legends of the battle of Kettle Creek say that 340 brave Patriots marched and defeated 750 British soldiers at the battle of Kettle Creek. Recent Archaeological work gives evidence for a different description of the battle. About 310 Patriots in groups of about 50 men performed a mounted charge that resulted in the defeat of about 300 poorly trained British regulars (Militia like) in about one hour. Facts and maps will illustrate the new battle description.





Important Decisions At October 26, 2019 BOM Meeting

It turned out to be a great day for Ft. Dooly and our Park Ceremony. There were several votes taken concerning our park ceremony and the research being done at Elijah Clark State Park for Ft. Dooly. The first one was for our request for a contribution from the Endowment Trust Fund.

President Collins reported that the vote was two for and one against. Don Burdick was the one against and he got up and spoke against the request in that he didn't think it met the requirements as being from an organization outside the SAR. He thought it was for an individuals own research project. I explained that the request came from the Friends of the park, which made the request, was a 501 C3 organization and they were handling the money to be paid out for the ground penetrating radar. The BOM members voted over whelming to approve the request. The trust fund is now valued at \$79,218.58 and has \$3,394.43 to distribute this year. There were no other requests for fund distribution.

The next vote was for the report that Chairman Jay Guest gave from the Historical sites and Celebrations Committee. He stated that the Committee had recommended that the park ceremony be moved to Sunday and that the Committee would recommend approval it they moved it. Rev. Alan Smith and I spoke against the recommendation. The BOM Members again voted against the recommendation with such an over whelming vote that no show of hands were required.

The next vote taken was to bring up Rev. Alan Smiths past motion to make the Park Ceremony a state event and include it along with the Kettle Creek Ceremony In future advertisements. Dr. Rigel voiced his opposition in that he felt it interfered with the National Event of the Kettle Creek Ceremony that was held the next day.

After much discussion President Collins asked the State Chancellor to render an opinion. He did and said that he didn't see how it would interfere with any of their activities in any way. A motion was made to bring the vote before the BOM Members and by voice vote, it once again passed. A vote was then taken by paper ballot and passed 36 or 38 (don't remember exact number) to 14 with two Members abstaining. Like I said it was a great day for Ft. Dooly research and the Park Ceremony.

Limited Supply of Books Remaining (there will not be more).

If you have been thinking about purchasing a book now is the time.

The proceeds from the book to the Atlanta Chapter are approximately **\$19,000** To put that into perspective, our Chapter would normally have less than \$1,000 per year available to fund the types of projects that these proceeds will fund. This is a monumental opportunity that David and Richard have made available to our Chapter and to the preservation of the 42 known battle sites in Georgia. Members are encouraged to purchase a book for personal use or as a donation to a library or

other organization. Out of 300 books the chapter has distributed two thirds of the books. There are less than 40 books remaining.

The Chapter has set a goal to get copies of this book into as many libraries and research facilities in Georgia and across the nation as possible. To achieve this, we are encouraging the purchase and donation of books. All net proceeds from the sale of the book will be used to preserve and support research of Georgia Revolutionary War battle sites. Parking

Some members have asked about parking at Petite Violette. They provide valet parking and there is some parking available at the office building next door at 2948 Clairmont Rd. Below is a photo of the path from this parking area at the first Visitor Parking sign to the restaurant.



Have you had a difficult time leaving Petite Violette to go back North on Clairmont Rd? If so here are a couple of potential solutions (see map below):

- 1) Exit to the right and get into the far-left lane as though you were going to get onto I-85 North, instead make a Uturn under I-85 on Clairmont.
- 2) Exit to the right and turn right as though you were going to I-85 South, stay in the far-right lane on the frontage road and then turn right onto Briarwood Road between the Life Storage building and REI. This will take you to Buford Highway where you can turn right which will take you back to Clairmont Rd.
