#### **Proclamation**

## Honoring the Marquis de Lafayette on the Occasion of the 264th Anniversary of His Birth.

WHEREAS, Marie-Joseph-Paul-Yves-Roch-Gilbert du Motier, commonly known as the Marquis de Lafayette, was born on September 6, 1757, and occupies a considerable place in the history of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, Lafayette was a man of considerable military skill who expressed sympathy for American revolutionary fighters, decided to aid colonists in their struggle for independence, and was voted by Congress the rank and commission of Major General in the Continental Army; and

WHEREAS, Lafayette's military service was invaluable to General George Washington during many Revolutionary War battles, earning him the title of 'the soldier's friend'; and

WHEREAS, Lafayette's strategic thinking, military skill, and dedication as a general officer serves as a model for present day American military officers; and

WHEREAS, the Continental Congress appropriated awards and honors in honor of Lafayette's service to the American people, including the commissioning of a portrait that hangs in the Chamber of the United States House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS, because of Lafayette's strong belief in freedom, he advocated the abolition of slavery in the Americas, favored equal legal rights for religious minorities in France, and became a prominent figure in the French Revolution; and

WHEREAS, in 1824, at the invitation of President Monroe, Lafayette embarked upon a triumphant, yearlong tour of all twenty-five states of the then-United States, during which he became the first foreign dignitary to address a joint session of Congress, and visited many Masonic bodies; and

WHEREAS, upon his historic visit to the City of Savannah on April 19, 1825, he was welcomed with a salute by the Chatham Artillery. On the 21<sup>st</sup>, Freemasons met with Lafayette as he laid the cornerstones to the monuments to General Nathaniel Greene and Casimir Pulaski. After Lafayette reached Augusta on April 23<sup>rd</sup>, the town celebrated for 48 hours; and

WHEREAS, because of America's affection for Lafayette, many United States cities, towns, and counties, including LaFayette, Georgia. and LaGrange, Georgia (his French estate) have been named for him; and

**WHEREAS**, the achievements of Lafayette and the examples set by his conduct and selfless love of liberty have been and will continue to be a valuable legacy for the future of the United States and the world; and


WHEREAS, the Georgia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, an organization of lineal descendents of the patriots of the American Revolution, encourages public observances of the Marquis de Lafayette's birthday on September 6th to commemorate his life and character as it relates to the future of the nation and the welfare of free people everywhere; now

**THEREFORE**, I, David Jessel, President of the Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution, do hereby encourage all Georgia Society Chapters to observe September 6, 2021 as Marquis de Lafayette Day in Georgia.

# 131<sup>st</sup> Nation Congress awards Atlanta chapter DR. David Noble the Liberty Medal with two oak leaf clusters




The liberty Medal is given in recognition to those compatriots that have recruited new members receive one oak leaf cluster for every 10 new members recruited. Thank you Dr Noble.

### **Veterans Respect**

The role of the Veterans Respect Committee is to pursue opportunities to honor and recognize current service members and veterans of past service. A wide range of activities fall under this charge. Some examples are:

- -hours served in the VA Hospital (VAH) Volunteer Service,
- -visiting a veteran in a VAH, nursing home or private home,
- -donating personal care items to a VAH or nursing home serving veterans,
- -donating publications to a VAH,
- -organizing an outing for one or more veterans,
- -participating in a veteran's funeral as a participant, pallbearer, or attendee,
- -attendance at Revolutionary War Veteran's Grave Marking,
- -participating in placing flags or wreaths on veteran's graves.

Each year our chapter submits information for the USS Stark Memorial Ward. It is based on a compilation of our Veterans Respect activities. A major effort for the last couple of years has been our purchase of VA Canteen Coupon Book and that will continue.

However, there is another easy and inexpensive way to earn points. The Stark Award scoring allows us to earn 1 point for every personal care item donated to the VA. An easy way to do that is to purchase bottled water (8 oz.) and give it to the VA Clinic in Decatur. A 24-bottle case can usually be purchased for between \$4-5, but often less. For this \$5 purchase and donation we receive 24 points! There is a Kroger near the clinic where it can be purchased. Patriot Chest/Trunk Program

#### Reimbursement Process:

13 Mar – Hermitage, Tenn

The Patriot Chest Program is an interactive presentation, intended to compliment Elementary and Middle School lesson plans on the Revolutionary War and Colonial Period of American History.

SAR Outreach Education will be serving as the source for State Societies and their chapters to obtain a Patriot Chest DVD and receive reimbursement up to \$375 for identified contents purchased to develop their own Patriot Chest. The contents include period clothing, toys, household, hunting and military items. The average cost of a complete Patriot Chest is about \$500. Reimbursements will be made according to the following guidelines.

One \$375.00 reimbursement for each Chest costing more than \$500.00.

Maximum of two Patriot Chests per State Society.

Maximum of \$750 for the life of the program per State Society.

Reimbursements will be at 75% of total receipts up to \$500.

Only identified items pertaining to the presentation of the Patriot Chest Program will be reimbursed. No exceptions.

Reimbursement requests must include itemized list of objects that reflect the submitted receipts will qualify to be reimbursed.

Receipts and itemized list must accompany the submitted request for reimbursement.

Please mark all submitted material "Patriot Chest Reimbursement."

Send all documented receipts at one time for one payment.

All reimbursements will be made payable to the State Society.

#### **NSSAR online Youth Protection Program**

Our National Society has developed an online **Youth Protection Program** that is designed to be taken by anyone who has regular contact with young people through any of the Sons of the American Revolution programs, such as the Traveling Trunk program, any classroom presentation given in our area schools, or situations where our members are participating in events where the general public and young people may attend.

It is highly recommended that we all consider taking this short online training program.

To complete the online **Youth Protection Training Program** it will take you between 20 and 30 minutes. It is available on the National SAR Web Site under the **elearning tab** on the blue banner on the home page or at <a href="https://www.sar.org/courses/youth-protection-training/">https://www.sar.org/courses/youth-protection-training/</a>

Make sure you login using your regular SAR login, and your name and other pertinent information will be captured for the record and used to populate your certificate. If you do not log in, you will not be able to take the training, get a certificate, or have your name entered on the compliance database. An example of the certificate of completion is attached.

#### **GASSAR 2022 Online Dues Collection**

The dues collection process 2022 is underway. Notices were sent out via email on August 9, 2021. Your chapter has elected to participate in the online dues process this year after a highly successful rollout to a pilot program for 2021. For those of you that participated in the pilot program, this document will serve as a review and an information source should you have questions.

Before getting into the mechanics of the online dues payment process, here are a few basics for 2022 dues collection:

- The deadline for submission of dues is October 31, 2021, and must be received by the GASSAR Secretary by this date. This deadline applies to both dues paid online and by check.
- Online dues payments are optional. Members may still choose to send checks directly to the chapter. Submission of chapter dues payments to GASSAR must follow guidelines provided by the GASSAR Secretary.
- Funds received by GASSAR through the online process on behalf of the chapter will be paid via check monthly by the GASSAR Treasurer. Reports will be provided regularly by the GASSAR Secretary showing all online dues activity for your chapter.
- GASSAR incurs processing fees for online payments. These fees equal 3.459% of the transaction amount plus \$0.49 per transaction. Since these fees are not included in the National, State or Chapter fee structure, the fees are added to the amount charged for online payments. For example, a chapter charging \$10.00 annual dues for a regular member, the chapter dues will appear as \$10.46. Similar adjustments are made for the National and State dues, with the \$0.49 per transaction fee being included in the State dues amount (e.g. \$19.16 for a regular member). Chapters electing to have optional payments in variable amounts will receive those payments net of the 3.549% fee (e.g. a chapter asking for donations in any amount will receive that donation less the 3.549% fee (e.g. a \$10.00 donation will produce a \$9.65 receipt to the chapter).
- The online dues process consists of two steps, registration and then payment. The registration process is simply setting up an account for the member and verifying their information. The verification step is necessary for two reasons: to ensure that only GASSAR members can login to the member area; and to ensure that the information provided by the member is accurate since payments are processed and credited to them automatically based on this information (during the 2021 pilot program, approximately 10% of all members registering made mistakes by either entering an incorrect national/state member number or stating an incorrect membership type. Members that registered for the 2021 pilot program are already registered and do not need to register again. An email address can only used in association with one member. For families with more than one member using the same email address, the registered member may pay dues for family members, or others, from their login. Instructions for doing this are shown below.

The process is intuitive, but I have attempted to anticipate any questions that may arise.



This page will then open. If the member is not registered, click on "here" in the top line that reads "You must be registered to login to GASocietySAR.org. If you have not yet registered, Click here to register". If the member is already registered, skip to Dues Payments.



The registration page is straight forward. Note that only 21 of the 35 GASSAR chapters have chosen to participate in the online dues payment program. To register, you must be a member of one of these chapters (listed on page). The member simply fills in the required information. It is critical that the correct national/state membership numbers be provided along with the current membership type (e.g. regular, junior, lifetime, junior lifetime or exempt). When complete, click "I am not a robot" and then "Register Now". A page will then display acknowledging the registration and a notice that the information must be verified by the system administrator prior to account



activation. This can take up to 24 hours as the administrator is not monitoring requests 24 hours/day.


#### **Dues Payments**

Payment of dues is accomplished by visiting the GASSAR website at <a href="www.gasociety.sar">www.gasociety.sar</a> and selecting "Login" under "Member Area" on the top bar menu (see image in Registration above) or by going directly to <a href="www.gasociety.sar/login">www.gasociety.sar/login</a>. When the login page is displayed, enter the username and password. Click "I'm not a robot" and "Login". If the password is forgotten, there is a link below the password field that will take you to instructions on how to reset the password.


The Member Area page will load and provides three payment options.

#### **Pay Dues**

Select "Pay Dues" to pay dues for the logged in member. The Dues Collection page will load and will be prepopulated with the member information, the dues structure appropriate for that chapter and member type, and optional payments as applicable.



All members will have the opportunity to make some optional payments: Friends of the NSSAR Library in Louisville - \$27.75; Become a Georgia Fellow - \$257.48; and if the member's chapter has identified one or more optional chapter programs. To contribute in any of these programs, click on the field and choose to participate or enter the donation amount if prompted.



On the Member Area screen select "Pay Dues for Family Member". The payment process is identical to the member payment process outlined above other than information about the member being paid for must be provided (see below). Simple fill in the requested fields and follow the above process. It is critical that the Name, NSSAR Number, GASSAR Number and Member Type to be entered accurately to ensure that the member receives credit for his dues. If in doubt, please verify first.



#### **Dual Memberships**

A member in good standing in a GASSAR chapter may elect to become a dual member of another GASSAR chapter. Provision to pay dual membership dues for any of the chapters participating in the online dues payment program can be made online. To be a dual member of another chapter, the member only needs to pay the chapter dues for that chapter.

On the Member Area screen select "Dual Memberships". The Dual Membership page will be loaded, again with the member's information preloaded on the page. Up to six dual memberships may be paid per visit to this page.

In the dropdown list select the chapter for the dual membership. Once selected, the option for another will be displayed and repeat until six chapters are selected or all desired chapters have been chosen. It is important to review the selections to ensure that only desired chapters have been selected. Once all desired dual memberships have been selected, proceed to payment.
