Program speaker: John Titus "Benjamin Franklin - The Retirement Years"

This presentation will cover the last half of Franklin's life and focus primarily on his roles as politician, diplomat and statesman. Franklin became wealthy through his successful printing business and the popular "Poor Richard's Almanack," enabling him to hire a partner to manage the daily operations while he focused on his passions. At the age of 42, his "retirement" involved significant public achievements, including his work as a diplomat, writer, inventor, and a key figure in the creation of the United States of America.

September Chapter Meeting

Our Atlanta Chapter speaker for September was compatriot John Hines Sr., who delivered a program on the "The Overmountain Men". Hines was inducted into the SAR in February 2025 during our George Washington's Luncheon. Chapter leadership thanks compatriot Hines for his willingness to contribute to the Atlanta Chapter programs. During the luncheon we also had two compatriots who received NSSAR Supplemental Ancestor Certificates. Bill Goodman received his for proving his lineage to Patriot Absolom Bedell who was a Major under Col George Wells. Patriot Bedell was born in Pennsylvania, died in Greene County Georgia before 4 Oct 1802, and also served as a Justice in 1779-80. Atlanta Chapter Historian Kenneth Thomas, Jr. received two NSSAR Supplemental Ancestor Certificates for proving his lineage to Patriot ancestors Robert Brooks and Nicholas Christenbury. (below) Supplemental Ancestor Certificates help others to join the SAR, by providing a proof document & cited sources making it easier for new members to connect to a Patriot.

Patriot Robert Brooks was from Mecklenburg Co., Virginia, and supplied food to the patriot forces as his patriot service qualification. He died in Mecklenburg County, VA, in 1806, leaving a large number of descendants who had even by then trickled on down to Edgefield Co., SC and later on to Georgia. Brooks is direct ancestor to Kenneth's maternal Grandfather, Joseph H. Brooks, III. Nicholas Christenbury, most likely born in Virginia, was living in Caswell County, NC, on the Virginia line, during the Revolutionary War. His patriot service is based on his applying for a land grant there, and to do so, you had to swear an oath supporting the patriot cause. After the Revolutionary War he moved to the Charlotte, NC area by 1790 and died there in 1813-1814. He left a large number of future descendants who are the subject of a book and for many decades a family reunion. This is the first line anyone has joined SAR on him, thus opening up a new line for many others to use to join.

Lincolnton 5 Patriot Grave Marking







On Saturday the 27th of September our Atlanta Chapter Co-Sponsored a 5 Patriot Grave Marking ceremony at St. Paul's Church in Lincolnton, GA. The Dedication Ceremony designed to honor the Revolutionary War Service of Patriots Hezekiah Bussey, Zachariah Spires, William Norman, Moses Jones and Isaac Cliatt, was originally to take place in the Church Cemetery, but due to pouring rain was held inside the Church Fellowship Hall. Still, the ceremony had all the usual wreaths, Color Guardsmen flags & muskets, minus the white smoke and tantalizing aroma of spent Black Powder from canon & musket fire. Atlanta Chapter President Gregory Smith presented the Atlanta Chapter Wreath and GASSAR Chaplain Edward M. Anderson Sr. gave the Invocation & Benediction.

Information to the property where the Ceremonies will be held. 1884 Coldwater Rd. Elberton, Ga 30635. Note: Correct GPS is N 34.22496 / W -82.83318. If you put 1884 Coldwater Rd. in your maps you will be approx. 2/10 mile SE of the parking. You will need to park on the side of the road. There is limited parking on the owner's property. We do have to use the property owner's driveway.

<u>Directions from Downtown Elberton:</u> (Intersection of Highway 17 and Highway 77 go North 3.2 Miles turn right on HWY 368 (Lake RB Russell State Park Sign). In 2.4 miles bear left on Double Branches Rd. In 2.9 miles turn left on Coldwater Rd.

<u>Directions from Hartwell</u> (Benson St & East Howell St. turn right (south) at City Hall on Benson St./Hwy 77. Go 6.8 Miles turn left on Coldwater Rd. go by the Dollar General. Drive 4.8 miles the grave marking parking is approx. 6/10 miles past Coldwater United Methodist Church.

Please bring your own chair. The grave ceremony area is in a wooded area next with a personal road in the woods.





The Sons of the American Revolution honors our patriot ancestors by promoting patriotism, serving our communities, and educating and inspiring future generations about the founding principles of our country.








National Society, Sons of the American Revolution

The recognition program is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters and societies that participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the events and heroes of the period surrounding the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers any event celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary. This therefore will cover any public events celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary in the period from 2014 to 2033. Forms may be submitted for multiple years Scorekeeping is the responsibility of each compatriot and awarding authority. The awarding authority for each medal is as follows. The Bronze Medal is authorized and recorded by the local chapter. The Silver Medal is Authorized and recorded by the state society. The Gold Medal only is authorized and recorded by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee. Only Gold Medal applications should be submitted to the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee using the email address below:

- a. Directing, chairing or co-chairing an event or sub-committee for the duration of the event. (20 points)
- b. Participation in the planning, financing, promotion or conduct of an event other than directing, chairing, or cochairing an event. Those that do direct, chair or co-chair and event and also serve as a regular member of a committee or sub-committee in a non-leadership role, may also earn points. (10 points)
- c. Attending an Event (3 points)
- d. Attending an event in Colonial Attire (5 points)

Points are cumulative. The maximum points that can be awarded for any one event is 28 points.

> SAR Members may be awarded the Medals for achieving the following levels:

- a. Bronze Medal: 25 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state.
- b. Silver Medal: 60 promotion points as certified by his state society.
- c. Gold Medal: 150 promotion points as certified by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee.

Non-SAR members may also be awarded these medals:

- a. The chapter may present bronze awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the state or national society for higher recognition.
- b. The state and district may present silver awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the national society for higher recognition.
- c. The national society may present gold awards to its Partners in Patriotism.
- ➤ <u>Streamer.</u> Streamers are available for chapters, state societies and districts to present to Partners in Patriotism for attendance or participation in a 250th Anniversary Event. i.e. Scouting Units, DAR Chapters, etc. They are available for purchase from merchandising at a cost of \$5.00 each.

Veterans Respect Activities

Our chapter has donated close to \$6,000.00 to the VA since this project began in early 2019 to purchase VA Canteen Coupon Books which patients can use in the canteen, coffee shop or cafeteria at the VAH, Decatur. These books will be distributed by the VA Volunteer Service at the hospital. At each meeting there will be a jar marked "\$ for VA Canteen Coupon Books" to accept donations. Please look for it and contribute a dollar (or more).

The role of the Veterans Respect Committee is to pursue opportunities to honor and recognize current service members and veterans of past service. A wide range of activities fall under this charge. Some examples are:

- -hours served in the VA Hospital (VAH) Volunteer Service,
- -visiting a veteran in a VAH, nursing home or private home,
- -donating personal care items to a VAH or nursing home serving veterans,
- -donating publications to a VAH,
- -organizing an outing for one or more veterans,
- -participating in a veteran's funeral as a participant, pallbearer, or attendee,
- -attendance at Revolutionary War Veteran's Grave Marking,
- -participating in placing flags or wreaths on veteran's graves.

We are aware that many of our Atlanta Chapter members have been involved in such activities, but we do not know the extent. We would like to gather information on such efforts.
