In cooperation with The Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum and the Carter Center, the Georgia Society SAR sponsored a Liberty Tree dedication on Thursday, October 16th, recognizing the 250th Anniversary of the United States of America, 1776-2026. It was held at the Carter Center in honor of President James Earl Carter, Jr. Atlanta Chapter President Gregory Smith & GASSAR Chaplain Edward M. Anderson were in attendance.

This Liberty Tree Dedication is part of a nationwide movement planting 250 Liberty Trees across the country. President Jimmy Carter, SAR National # 134672 & Life Member # 4377, joined the Atlanta Chapter of the Georgia Society SAR on March 26th 1990, through the Service of his Patriot Ancestor Private Perry Scott of Sussex, Delaware who served under Captain Allen McLane in the Continental Army. Around 1990, President Carter transferred to the Button Gwinnett Chapter SAR where Carter's SAR Life Membership was approved June 12th 2024.

On Sunday, October 12, 2025, the National Society of the Washington Family Descendants attended the Choral Eucharist at Zion Episcopal Church in Charles Town, WV. President George Washington's youngest brother Charles founded the town in 1786, naming many of the streets after his brothers and wife. His estate, **Happy Retreat**, was erected in 1780 and still stands today.

NSWFD President General Richard Weaver presented a silver tray to the church on behalf of the society. The Washington Family Memorial Service was also held in the Zion Church cemetery where over 70 plus members of the Washington family are buried. Several generations of the Wysong family are buried there as well, beginning with Michael Wysong, the 4th great-grandfather of Compatriot George Wysong.

The group toured Claymont Court, built by Bushrod Corbin Washington, the son of General Washington's brother, John Augustine Washington. That night, the family celebrated the 71st NSWFD Annual Dinner & Meeting at the Bavarian Inn of Shepherdstown, WV. Dale Sayers performed "The Life and Times of Dolly Madison".



250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Recognition Program

National Society, Sons of the American Revolution



The recognition program is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters and societies that participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the events and heroes of the period surrounding the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers any event celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary. This therefore will cover any public events celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary in the period from 2014 to 2033. Forms may be submitted for multiple years Scorekeeping is the responsibility of each compatriot and awarding authority. The awarding authority for each medal is as follows. The Bronze Medal is authorized and recorded by the local chapter. The Silver Medal is Authorized and recorded by the state society. The Gold Medal only is authorized and recorded by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee. Only Gold Medal applications should be submitted to the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee using the email address below:

PLEASE SUBMIT TO: 250AnniversaryRecognition@sar.org.



Upon approval of the Gold Medal an email will be sent to the individual authorizing them to purchase the 250th Anniversary Gold Medal from merchandising.

> Awards are based on activity and the awarding of points for each type of activity:

- a. Directing, chairing or co-chairing an event or sub-committee for the duration of the event. (20 points)
- b. Participation in the planning, financing, promotion or conduct of an event other than directing, chairing, or cochairing an event. Those that do direct, chair or co-chair and event and also serve as a regular member of a committee or sub-committee in a non-leadership role, may also earn points. (10 points)
- c. Attending an Event (3 points)
- d. Attending an event in Colonial Attire (5 points)

Points are cumulative. The maximum points that can be awarded for any one event is 28 points.

> SAR Members may be awarded the Medals for achieving the following levels:

- a. Bronze Medal: 25 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state.
- b. Silver Medal: 60 promotion points as certified by his state society.
- c. Gold Medal: 150 promotion points as certified by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee.

Non-SAR members may also be awarded these medals:

- a. The chapter may present bronze awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the state or national society for higher recognition.
- b. The state and district may present silver awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the national society for higher recognition.
- c. The national society may present gold awards to its Partners in Patriotism.
- ➤ <u>Streamer.</u> Streamers are available for chapters, state societies and districts to present to Partners in Patriotism for attendance or participation in a 250th Anniversary Event. i.e. Scouting Units, DAR Chapters, etc. They are available for purchase from merchandising at a cost of \$5.00 each.

Veterans Respect Activities

Our chapter has donated close to \$6,000.00 to the VA since this project began in early 2019 to purchase VA Canteen Coupon Books which patients can use in the canteen, coffee shop or cafeteria at the VAH, Decatur. These books will be distributed by the VA Volunteer Service at the hospital. At each meeting there will be a jar marked "\$ for VA Canteen Coupon Books" to accept donations. Please look for it and contribute a dollar (or more).

The role of the Veterans Respect Committee is to pursue opportunities to honor and recognize current service members and veterans of past service. A wide range of activities fall under this charge. Some examples are:

- -hours served in the VA Hospital (VAH) Volunteer Service,
- -visiting a veteran in a VAH, nursing home or private home,
- -donating personal care items to a VAH or nursing home serving veterans,
- -donating publications to a VAH,
- -organizing an outing for one or more veterans,
- -participating in a veteran's funeral as a participant, pallbearer, or attendee,
- -attendance at Revolutionary War Veteran's Grave Marking,
- -participating in placing flags or wreaths on veteran's graves.

We are aware that many of our Atlanta Chapter members have been involved in such activities, but we do not know the extent. We would like to gather information on such efforts. If you have been involved in any such activities since January 1, 2025, please report the details to our Chaplain John Titus.
