
Program speaker: Compatriot Chuck Garnett, President of the KCBA "Kettle Creek Battlefield Association & 250th Anniversary Celebration"

This presentation will cover the Battle of Kettle Creek, its significance in the Revolutionary War as a major blow to British strategy in the South, the history of the battlefield's preservation, and current projects, including the use of cutting-edge science and archaeology to study human remains found there. The site is unique because it serves as both a battlefield and a cemetery.

November Chapter Meeting

Our Atlanta Chapter speaker for November was Chapter Historian Ken Thomas, Jr. who delivered an excellent program on the Revolutionary War through his Ancestors' pension records. During this program, Members heard the history of the Revolutionary War directly through the authentic "voice of the patriots" found in their pension records, which offers a unique and engaging perspective on the past. We also had two compatriots, Mark Whitmire and his son, Thomas, who were inducted into the Atlanta Chapter and received their New Member Certificates using Frederick Thompson as their qualifying Patriot. Thompson was from South Carolina, serving as a private under Captain Meredith, and Cols Martin, Armstrong and Phillips. Thompson's Georgia Pension application was dated July 1823 & he died in Georgia on 24 April 1842. Our Chapter participated in a 5 Patriot Grave Marking on the 1st at the Sugar Hill Historic Cemetery as seen in below pages. We also attended a DAR Veterans Day celebration on the 8th in Buckhead with the Atlanta Chapter DAR. Chapter meetings and Patriot Grave Markings can be counted for the NSSAR 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Recognition Program.





Update on the Colonel John Dooly Granite Cenotaph

With the carving now compete, as seen in photo on left, it is now ready for transport. It will be set in place at Elijah Clark State Park in time for the Heroes of the Hornets' nest Ceremony taking place Friday, February 13, 2026 at 11 a.m. Back in March, Atlanta Chapter SAR members voted on a cash donation of \$2,000 to support the then proposed granite Cenotaph for Colonel John Dooly and his wife Diannah Mitchell. The Dooly Cenotaph will ultimately stand next to the granite Cenotaph headstone of Elijah and Hannah Clark at the Elijah Clark State Park, near Lincolnton, GA. The total quoted cost of the project was \$13,775 from Mr. Ron Clamp of the Cornerstone Dimensional Stone Co. The Georgia Society SAR made this a reality led by The Little River Chapter SAR who has spearheaded this much needed project.

New Georgia Tag in 2026



Georgia will have a special license plate to commemorate the United States' 250th anniversary from 2026 through 2030. The design was selected from submissions by Georgia middle school students. The bill authorizing the license plate specifies that it will be in addition to the regular license plates and will be available from January 1, 2026.

Participation in veteran's funeral: Attire (colonial or business), specific role (reader, pallbearer, etc., hours, miles driven.



250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Recognition Program



National Society, Sons of the American Revolution

The recognition program is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters and societies that participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the events and heroes of the period surrounding the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers any event celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary. This therefore will cover any public events celebrating and promoting the 250th Anniversary in the period from 2014 to 2033. Forms may be submitted for multiple years Scorekeeping is the responsibility of each compatriot and awarding authority. The awarding authority for each medal is as follows. The Bronze Medal is authorized and recorded by the local chapter. The Silver Medal is Authorized and recorded by the state society. The Gold Medal only is authorized and recorded by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee. Only Gold Medal applications should be submitted to the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee using the email address below:

Upon approval of the Gold Medal an email will be sent to the individual authorizing them to purchase the 250th Anniversary Gold Medal from merchandising.

Awards are based on activity and the awarding of points for each type of activity:

- a. Directing, chairing or co-chairing an event or sub-committee for the duration of the event. (20 points)
- b. Participation in the planning, financing, promotion or conduct of an event other than directing, chairing, or co-chairing an event. Those that do direct, chair or co-chair and event and also serve as a regular member of a committee or sub-committee in a non-leadership role, may also earn points. (10 points)
- c. Attending an Event (3 points)
- d. Attending an event in Colonial Attire (5 points)

Points are cumulative. The maximum points that can be awarded for any one event is 28 points.

> SAR Members may be awarded the Medals for achieving the following levels:

- a. Bronze Medal: 25 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state.
- b. Silver Medal: 60 promotion points as certified by his state society.
- c. Gold Medal: 150 promotion points as certified by the NSSAR 250th Anniversary Committee.

> Non-SAR members may also be awarded these medals:

- a. The chapter may present bronze awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the state or national society for higher recognition.
- b. The state and district may present silver awards to its Partners in Patriotism, and may recommend its Partners to the national society for higher recognition.
- c. The national society may present gold awards to its Partners in Patriotism.
- ➤ <u>Streamer.</u> Streamers are available for chapters, state societies and districts to present to Partners in Patriotism for attendance or participation in a 250th Anniversary Event. i.e. Scouting Units, DAR Chapters, etc. They are available for purchase from merchandising at a cost of \$5.00 each.



Veterans Respect Activities

Our chapter has donated close to \$6,000.00 to the VA since this project began in early 2019 to purchase VA Canteen Coupon Books which patients can use in the canteen, coffee shop or cafeteria at the VAH, Decatur. These books will be distributed by the VA Volunteer Service at the hospital. At each meeting there will be a jar marked "\$ for VA Canteen Coupon Books" to accept donations.
